TREE PLANTING WITH FRIENDS

Friends of Yellagonga Regional Park or FOY are a group of local enthusiastic conservation volunteers. They desire to protect and restore the biodiversity of Yellagonga Regional Park that is situated in Perth's northern suburbs, for current and future generations to enjoy. Formed in 1993 and working in tandem with the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPAW), their aim is to promote and participate in the conservation, rehabilitation and protection of Yellagonga Regional Park to ensure long-term environmental sustainability and compatible human use.

FOY manages several sites within the park and on Friday 20 May, a team of volunteers from BHP's MECoE Planning & Scheduling, Strategy Ops and Repairs & Warranty joined FOY at their site in Kingsley. The task for the day was to plant some native seedlings along a bare patch of land between Wanneroo Road and Lake Goollelal, After a demonstration of what to do, the team quickly got to work, planting a variety of native tube stock across the location. As the day wrapped up, the team had planted and watered all available stock, helping to ensure the area continues to thrive by promoting fauna, hindering erosion and assisting in nutrient removal.

In the coming months, these plants will hopefully begin to bloom – with some of the team eager to see their days work paying off. Well done BHP!
