


## LEADING THE PACK

Dismantle is a non-for-profit that exists to provide young people with enabling support so they can manage their life in a self-directed way. Dismantle uses bikes as a tool to empower young people through their multiple programs, including their Bike Rescue program and ReNew Property Maintenance. Dismantle also provides ongoing training, equipment, guidance and support to regional partners to ensure sustainability and impact for young people and their communities.

On Thursday 26 April, BHP's B Crew Mine Control team chose to volunteer their time helping Dismantle with continuing workshop tasks. The session began with an outline of the day from Georgina, the Volunteer Coordinator at Dismantle, who spoke about the organisation and the services they provide.

After this, the team was able to set up in the undercover parking garage and got put to work. The first order of business was to move the bicycles from one end of the garage to the other. The team formed a production line and some took the opportunity to take the donated bikes for a spin around the garage. The next task of the day was to work on the bikes, stripping spare parts and sorting them into piles. The team had to decide whether or not the parts were salvable (with the trusty assistance of Georgina) and could be re-used to build a new bike. Any sorted spare parts will be used for Dismantle's BikeRescue program to replace broken or missing parts on the participant's bikes.

The team did an amazing job at Dismantle and we hope they learned some new skills about bikes and deepened their knowledge about the good work Dismantle does for the community. A job well done and thanks BHP!
