





BHP AT WA WILDLIFE

WA Wildlife (originally known as Native Arc) has been on an extremely exciting journey over the last decade and created WA's first wildlife veterinary hospital. As a not-for-profit organisation, WA Wildlife provides medical care and rehabilitation services for approximately four thousand injured, sick, and orphaned native wildlife each year. Located in the south metropolitan region of Perth, WA Wildlife receives injured wildlife from a variety of sources including the public, veterinarian clinics, local councils, rangers, and other wildlife centres.

On September 30th, 2022, 8 volunteers from BHP spent their day cleaning out aviaries and moving them outside the property, repurposing compost bins by turning them into garden beds, and moving sand into new enclosures. After the hard work was done the team had the opportunity to see Karen remove ticks out of a native bobtail found during the clean-up, which was later reintroduced back into the wild. At lunch time the team got to meet (and cuddle) the resident Joey. As the day ended, all 8 volunteers got to meet the animals and take some memorable pictures with them!

Overall, the team had a brilliant day, it being described by all as fun, rewarding, and exciting! Most of the highlights were meeting all the furry (and not so furry) friends and being able to make a difference to the wellbeing of each animal.
