## BIG WINS AT BIRDS OF PREY



The Western Australian Birds of Prey Centre is home to the famous West Coast Eagles mascot, Auzzie, the Wedge-tailed Eagle. The centre was first established in 2000 and is heavily involved in rehabilitation and conservation of the injured and sick Birds of Prey (BOP), as well as education and entertainment through flying displays and sessions for schools.
