They create New Baby Boxes filled with 'little things' to assist families care for their newborn such as nappies, wipes, clothing, blankets and books. They distribute New Baby Boxes via their partners including non-profit support services, hospitals and government agencies. They are committed to providing help and support for babies and their families in their time of need.

On Friday 23 July, Team Osmosis joined LTFTT at the Tuart Hill Community Centre for a day of sorting donations. The team of 17 kicked off their morning by hearing from Volunteer Coordinator Lori about the huge number of generous donations they have received of late from Narrogin and about the number of baby boxes they have been able to send into the community thanks to volunteers.

The team then quickly got to work, heading downstairs to wade through the overflowing donations, bringing them upstairs and distributing them around the room. Over the next few hours the team sorted through boxes and bags of donated baby bibs, hats, jumpsuits, jumpers and accessories and separated them into bundles of matching items/sizes. Other tasks throughout the day included rolling up all the blankets, packing down boxes, labelling new bags and packaging up sorted donations.
