WA Wildlife (originally known as Native Arc) is a not-for-profit organisation located on an A-class reserve in Bibra Lake which provides medical care and rehabilitation services for approximately 4000 injured, sick, and orphaned native wildlife each year. This wonderful organisation has been on a very exciting journey over the last decade, creating WA's first wildlife veterinary hospital. They are Western Australia's leading wildlife rescue, treatment and rehabilitation service, receiving injured animals from the public, veterinarian clinics, local councils, rangers, and other wildlife centres all across WA.

On Tuesday, 28 February 2023, the Geology team got together for a day of team building and site maintenance at WA Wildlife. The day commenced with an introduction of the organisation and an in-depth tour of the hospital and its wonderful facilities. The first team was in charge of digging two large holes (which will eventually turn into small ponds) within the enclosures. Being a particularly hot day, the team kept their spirits up and stayed mostly in the shade, with the misting machines on to keep cool. Other tasks included building a trench around the edge of an enclosure and securing with supportive wire. Once the wire was secured down, the trench was filled in with sand to complete the task.

After all their hard work in the summer heat, the team was able to meet and interact with some of the educational animals onsite. The team especially loved spending this time with Raffy the Black Cockatoo and Vinnie the Wombat and had a photo opportunity with the two resident Dingoes - Bindi and Banjo.
