A HELPING HAND

People Who Care is a volunteer-based not for profit organisation that has been serving the community for over 40 years. Offering services and support for those who are frail aged, those with a disability and families starting over following domestic violence and disruption. Their vision is to build resilient communities through the engagement of willing volunteers, helping others in need. They do this by providing practical support to people, such as home maintenance, gardening, transport and social and community participation. People Who Care employee gardeners who visit their client's homes once a month for 1 hour. Many of their client's homes require more work to be done than what can be achieved in the 1-hour visits so they rely on the assistance of corporate teams of volunteers.

On Thursday 12 January, 34 volunteers from BHPs First Year Intern Program spent the day at a residence in Lesmurdie, owned by Frank, one of People Who Care's clients. Frank lives alone and is unable to maintain his extensive garden, so both the front and back needed some work. After an introduction from both the Bens (People Who Care's Gardening Team), and after a quick tour of the garden, the team quickly put on their sunscreen and gloves and got to work. Dividing and conquering. the team split into different garden beds and areas throughout the property, clearing out overgrown weeds, trimming trees and bushes, picking up leaf litter, clearing areas around paths to allow access and removing dead and overgrown plants. By the afternoon and after filling up multiple bags of green waste, the team were able to completely transform Franks' property.
