Birds of Prey are currently going through a great expansion period and over the next few months will be building a new rehab center. Tasks on the agenda included gardening, removing leaves from aviary netting, cleaning and prepping the Donga bathroom for renovations and clearing the land surrounding the Donga.

The team were eager to work hard and accomplished an astounding amount of work in their half day of volunteering! By the lunch time there were 4 large piles of tree branches and organic waste ready to be burned off when winter comes.
