South East Regional Centre for Urban Landcare (SERCUL) is an independent community that implements strategic projects to improve the management and health of our natural resources such as waterways and ecosystems. SERCUL operates in the metropolitan and peri-urban areas of the Swan Catchment.

On the 4th June, six enthusiastic volunteers from BHP's Central Technology / Asset West Tech / Technology Team contributed their Friday to assist SERCUL with a planting and restoration project at Chelodina Reserve, which is located within the campus grounds of Murdoch University. The aim of this planting project is to provide a natural habitat and ecosystem for wildlife animals within the reserve. Through planting native seedlings, it will also prevent weeds from growing in the area.

After an introduction from SERCUL, the team got straight into the tasks and started choosing a variety of plants supplied by SERCUL to start the planting process. The team had the opportunity to utilise the Pottiputki, which is an efficient tool for manual planting of various sizes of containerized seedlings.
