TUESDAY TEAMWORK

Since 1963, St Bart's has been standing by the side of Western Australians experiencing homelessness, mental health challenges, trauma and hardship. When they first started, St Bart's was a small homeless shelter for men. Today they are a much more progressive, inclusive and larger organisation providing support to more than 530 clients through a range of services. Their goal is to provide safe, supported accommodation and services to people who need it the most, regardless of background, age, gender or ethnicity.

On 15 June, nine enthusiastic volunteers from BHP's SGTM, Geoscience and WAIO Team contributed their Tuesday to assist St Barts at Lime Street, East Perth. After an introduction, the team split into two groups. The first group cleaned the courtyard, such as sweeping, scrubbing the floor with soap, wiping the windows, and removing weeds. The second group cleaned St Bart's kitchens, such as spraying down chairs and tables, cleaning the fridges, and organising the cupboards. Some team members had the opportunity to use a floor cleaning machine. After lunch, the team headed to Brown Street, one of St Bart's older facilities, to remove and rake some dried leaves.

St Bart's greatly appreciated the team's assistance and help. The team has made a positive impact to the residents of St Bart's. Great work to this BHP team!
