

WETLAND WARRIORS

Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group (AGLG) is a community led group that coordinates landcare planning, river restoration, bushland management, community action and community awareness programs. With the help of thousands of volunteers each year, AGLG focuses on implementing on-ground restoration and revegetation projects as well as educating the community about local Landcare issues. These on-ground activities mainly involve planting native seedlings (trees, shrubs, herbs, sedges and rushes) and removing priority environmental weeds.

On 5 October, seventeen enthusiastic volunteers from BHP's Newman Mining Geology team contributed their Tuesday in assisting AGLG at Goolamrup Reserve in Kelmscott. After an introduction from Ross, the team put on their gloves, gumboots and collected the tools and was ready to get muddy. The team were tasked with planting native seedlings along the wetlands and creek line. The aim of the planting project is to provide a better habitat for wildlife and prevent weeds from infesting the area. Some team members used their power to cut down overgrown bamboo trees and made a massive pile at the end.

In such short hours, 'the team successfully managed to plant 2093 native seedlings at Goolamrup Reserve, which is an incredible result. This will significantly impact the reserve's ecosystem. Thanks to this awesome team. AGLG greatly appreciated the team's help!
